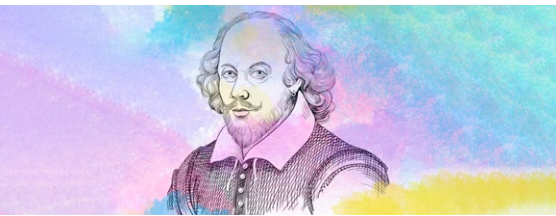

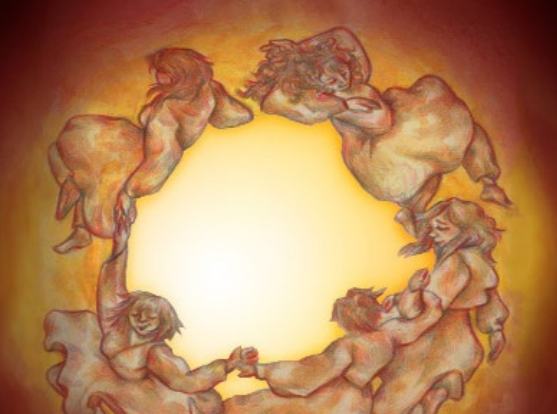

"Look at yourselves, will you! Just look at yourselves! Dancing at our time of day?... No, no, we're going to no harvest dance." (Kate, Act I)

Next Stage Theatre Company is proud to present Brian Friel's Olivier Award-winning play performed in-the-round. A semi-autobiographical exploration of the playwright's memories of growing up in rural Donegal, surrounded by his mother and her four sisters. Immerse yourself in their loving and chaotic household where financial hardship battles the sisters' fire and spirit.

The play is set over two days during the August and September of 1936 when Michael is seven years old. The village of Ballybeg celebrates the Festival of Lughnasa, named after the Celtic God of the Harvest. The arrival of the family's first wireless set, christened 'Marconi', coincides with the homecoming of Father Jack, 25 years a Missionary in Uganda and recovering from malaria. Internal frustrations and thwarted dreams collide with Pagan forces and Christian mores. Things are changing, change which is as devastating as it is inevitable.

"When I remember it, I think of it as dancing. Dancing with eyes half closed because to open them would be to break the spell." (Michael, Act II)

The elements are an essential part of our existence and understanding of the world around us. Students of Saint Gregory's Catholic College are passionate about protecting and celebrating nature.

This theme has inspired them to share their own experiences when creating these works and come together across year groups in collaboration and creatively respond to composers, artists, choreographers and playwrights.

Water – Water is an essential part of life. Wherever water flows life seems to spring up within and around it. It's a symbol of softness and flexibility. This is the inspiration behind our evening of dance which will flow between a range of styles in the form of solos, duets and group pieces.

Earth – Earth represents the qualities of heaviness and all aspects of life and death. Our production of *Blood Brothers* is a play that explores these concepts. This tragic and comedic play is about nature vs nurture, social class and how our futures can be shaped by the world in which we are born.

This event is also running at Burdall's Yard with **Air** on Tuesday 9th July and **Fire** on Friday 12th July.

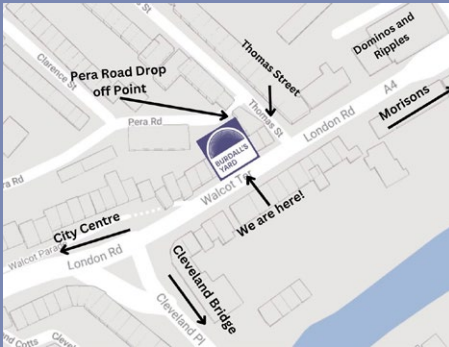
